Peace through Power-Sharing? A Critical Assessment

Wolfgang Dietrich holds the UNESCO Chair for Peace Studies at the University of Innsbruck/Austria and he is program director of the MA Program for Peace, Development, Security and International Conflict Transformation at the same University. He is member of the Austrian UNESCO Commission and visiting professor at the Institute for Political Science at the University of Vienna, at the Centre for Peace and Development Studies at the University of Castellón/Spain and at the United Nation's Peace University in Ciudad Colón/Costa Rica

Maja Zehfuss is Professor of International Politics at The University of Manchester. She is the author of Constructivism and International Relations: The Politics of Reality (Cambridge University Press 2002) and Wounds of Memory: The Politics of War in Germany (Cambridge University Press 2007) and the co-editor, with Jenny Edkins, of Global Politics: A New Introduction (Routledge 2008), now moving towards its second edition. Her current work examines how the problematic of ethics is produced, enacted and negotiated in war.

<u>Ian Carter</u> studied philosophy and politics in England at the Universities of Newcastle-Upon-Tyne (B.A.) and Manchester (M.A.), and in Italy at the European University Institute in Florence (PhD.). During 1992-3 he was Lecturer in Political Philosophy at the University of Manchester. Since 1993, he has been a member of the Department of Political and Social Studies at the University of Pavia, where he is currently Associate Professor in Political Philosophy. In 2003, he was a visiting Research Fellow at the University of Oxford.

Gerald Schneider, born in 1962 in Zürich, is Professor of International Politics and Executive Editor of "European Union Politics". He defended his doctoral thesis at the University of Zurich in 1991, worked as post-doc at the University of Michigan (Ann Arbor) for two years and was an assistant professor (1992 – 1995) at the Institut universitaire de hautes études internationales in Geneva. Before joining the faculty at Konstanz in 1997, he was a Professor of Political Science at the University of Stuttgart (1996-1997) and Program Director at the University of Berne (1994 – 1997).
